Product Description

Recombinant full-length human DGKE was expressed by baculovirus in Sf9 insect cells using an N-terminal GST tag. The DGKE gene accession number is <u>NM 003647</u>.

Formulation

Recombinant protein stored in 50mM Tris-HCl, pH 7.5, 150mM NaCl, 10mM glutathione, 0.1mM EDTA, 0.25mM DTT, 0.1mM PMSF, and 25% glycerol.

Storage and Stability

Store product at -70°C. For optimal storage, aliquot target into smaller quantities after centrifugation and store at recommended temperature. For most favorable performance, avoid repeated handling and multiple freeze/thaw cycles.

Scientific Background


Diacylglycerol kinase epsilon (DAG kinase epsilon) is the only member of class III diacylglycerol kinase family, which lacks the E-F hand motifs for Ca+ binding but possess a clear selectivity for arachidonoyl-containing species of diacylglycerol (1). DGK epsilon might decrease signals conducted via arachidonoyl-diacylglycerol or promotes the synthesis of phospholipids with certain fatty acids (1). DGK epsilon contributes to Huntington disease pathogenesis and its inhibition might be effect in the therapeutics (2). Also, recessive mutations in DGKE results in unrestricted complement activation in atypical hemolytic-uremic syndrome (3).



Specific Activity



The specific activity of DGKE was determined to be **3.9 nmol** /min/mg as per activity assay protocol.



The purity of DGKE was determined to be **>80%** by densitometry, approx. MW **91kDa**.

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ADP-Glo^m Activity Assay Protocol

Reaction Components

Active Kinase (Catalog #: D24-10G)

Active DGKE (0.05 μ g/ μ l) diluted with Kinase Dilution Buffer IX (Catalog #: K29-09) and assayed as outlined in sample activity plot. (Note: these are suggested working dilutions and it is recommended that the researcher perform a serial dilution of Active DGKE for optimal results).

Kinase Dilution Buffer IX (Catalog #: K29-09)

Kinase Assay Buffer III (Catalog #: K03-09) diluted at a 1:4 ratio (5X dilution) with cold water. Add freshly $50\mu M$ DTT to the aliquot prior to use.

Kinase Assay Buffer III (Catalog #: K03-09)

Buffer components: 200mM Tris-HCl, pH 7.4, 100mM MgCl_2 and 0.5 mg/ml BSA.

ADP-Glo™ Kinase Assay Kit (Promega, Cat # V9101)

ATP solution, 10 mM ADP solution, 10 mM ADP-Glo™ Reagent Kinase Detection Reagent

250 μM ATP Assay Solution

Prepare the ATP assay solution by diluting ATP solution, 10 mM (Promega, Cat # V9101) to 250 μ M in Kinase Dilution Buffer IX (Catalog #: K29-09).

Substrate (Catalog #: D430-59)

The substrate solution contains 10 mM of Dilauroyl-sn-glycerol in 100% DMSO solution. Dilute the substrate solution to 500 μ M in Lipid Dilution Buffer (Catalog #: L21-09) prior to use.

Assay Protocol

The DGKE assay is performed using the ADP-Glo™ Kinase Assay kit (Promega; Cat# V9101) which quantifies the amount of ADP produced by the DGKE reaction. The ADP- Glo™ Reagent is added to terminate the kinase reaction and to deplete the remaining ATP, and then the Kinase Detection Reagent is added to convert ADP to ATP and to measure the newly synthesized ATP using luciferase/luciferin reaction.

- Step 1. Thaw the Active DGKE, Kinase Assay Buffer, Substrate and Kinase Dilution Buffer on ice.
- Step 2. In a pre-cooled 96-well opaque plate, add the following reaction components bringing the initial reaction volume up to 20μl:
 - Component 1. 10µl of diluted Active DGKE (Catalog #D24-10G)
 - **Component 2.** 5µl of substrate solution
 - Component 3. 5µl Kinase Dilution Buffer IX with 0.1% Triton X-100
- Step 3. Set up the blank control as outlined in step 3, excluding the addition of the substrate. Replace the substrate with an equal volume of Kinase Dilution Buffer IX.
- Step 4. Initiate the reaction by the addition of 5μl of 250 μM ATP Assay Solution thereby bringing the final volume up to 25μl. Shake the reaction mixture in the 96-well opaque plate for 2 minutes and continue the incubation at 30°C for 40 minutes.
- Step 5. After the 40 minute incubation period, terminate the reaction and deplete the remaining ATP by adding 25µl of ADP-Glo™ Reagent. Shake the 96-well plate and then incubate the reaction mixture for another 40 minutes at ambient temperature.
- Step 6. Then add 50µl of the Kinase Detection Reagent to the 96-well plate and incubate the reaction mixture for another 30 minutes at ambient temperature.
- Step 7. Read the 96-well reaction plate using the KinaseGlo Luminescence Protocol on a GloMax plate reader (Promega; Cat# E7031).
- Step 8. Determine the corrected activity (RLU) by removing the blank control value (see Step 3) for each sample and calculate the kinase specific activity as outlined below.
